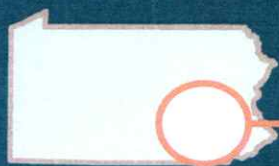

HEALTH ALERT!

The best protection against the measles virus is vaccination.

Your risk of developing measles is low if you are vaccinated or have had measles.

The measles virus can make you very sick and may cause lasting health effects, especially for:



babies



children younger than 5 years old



adults older than 20 years old



pregnant women



people with a weak immune system

If you feel well but have been around someone sick:



Watch for symptoms of measles which usually appear 7 to 14 days after contact with the virus.

If you are sick with a high fever, runny nose, cough, red/watery eyes, or a rash that breaks out 3-5 days after other symptoms:

You and your family should stay home, away from others to keep others from getting sick. Measles easily spreads from one person to another.



Call a doctor or hospital right away to let them know someone in your home may be sick with measles. They will give you instructions.



If the person who is sick gets rapidly worse, **call the emergency department** of a hospital to let them know you are coming and to get instructions for your arrival. **DO NOT WAIT.**
